## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

## Resolution No. 1191

WHEREAS, The Papago Council met on September 1, 1961 with a quorum present and at this time decided to rescind Resolution 505 approved November 28, 1950.

WHEREAS, In the past, Tribal heifers were sold arbitrarily \$.40 a head without regard to current market prices, and

WHEREAS, Before any sale of tribal cattle is made; the current Market Price as quoted in the daily papers will be checked and buyer charged accordingly.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED That a reduction of 20% of the prevailing market price on Tribal Herd Heifers be made to Papago Cattlemen desiring to improve their herd.

The fore'going resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on September 1, 1961 with a vote of 9 for and 7, against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (m), Article V, of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 984).
