RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1203

WHEREAS, Chester J. Higman, former Administrative Assistant to the Tribe, resigned in July and moved to Seattle, Washington, and the Tribe notified the State Employment Service that the position was vacant, and

WHEREAS, A Selection Committee, composed of 4 members of the Association for Papago Affairs, interviewed several applicants and finally chose as its one and only choice, Edward J. Sullivan, a lawyer from Buffalo, New York, and the Selection Committee made its choice on September 27th, and

WHEREAS, It was necessary to have an Administrative Assistant at once because much work had piled up since Mr. Higman left and help was also needed in arranging the Annual Rodeo, and there would be no Council meeting until October 27th to confirm such appointment, and the annual salary of the Assistant had been previously set at \$5,000 and \$1,000 additional for expenses, and

WHEREAS, The Agency Superintendent and the Tribal Chairman had previously agreed that Mr. Sullivan should commence work on October 2nd. and that his salary would commence on that date, all to be subject to the approval and acceptance by the Tribal Council at its October 27th meeting.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Tribal Council appoints Mr. Sullivan as its Administrative Assistant at the salary stated above and that the appointment and salary be made retroactive back to October 2nd and that the appointment made by the Tribal Chairman on October 2nd be hereby approved, confirmed and accepted.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on October 27th, 1961 with a vote of 17 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 4, Article III, of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
