RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

1211 RES. NO

WHEREAS, it has been well-known for some time that the Papago Tribe of Arizona and the Papago Indian Reservation are sorely in need of Economic Redevelopment, and

WHEREAS, it is thought that a Committee should be appointed to confer and consult with officials from the University of Arizona who have kindly volunteered their assistance in drafting a Plan and Application for submission to the proper authorities, and

WHEREAS, it is believed that a small Committee could work more expeditiously than the entire Tribal Council on this matter, and

WHEREAS, the Council feels that the members of this Committee should be compensated by the day and by mileage for the time spent in their duties as members of this Committee in the same manner and by the same rate as presently existing Committees of the Council are paid.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribal Chairman be, and he hereby is, empowered and authorized to appoint an Economic Redevelopment Committee to meet and confer with the necessary and proper officials with the view of drafting and preparing a Plan and Application to be submitted to the proper authorities on behalf of the Papago Indian Tribe, and that the members of this Committee be compensated by the day and by mileage for the time spent in their duties as members of this Committee in the same manner and by the same rate as presently existing Committees of the Council are paid.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on January 5, 1962, with a vote of 16 for, 0 against, and 3 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) 2 (e) and Section 3 (a), of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
