RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1213

WHEREAS, members of the Papago Tribe living in and around the City of Tucson have been waging a vigorous campaign for the establishment of an Indian Center in Tucson, and

WHEREAS, the Indian Center has been accepted and approved by the Tucson Community Council and will later become one of the participating agencies in the Community Chest Fund, and

WHEREAS, the Council feels there is a growing need for such an establishment in Tucson to act as a meeting place and a cultural center for off-Reservation Papagos in that area.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribal Council hereby endorses and approves the establishment of an Indian Center in Tucson and believes that such an establishment will be of great benefit and assistance to the Indian Citizens residing in the Tucson Area.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on January 5, 1962, with a vote of 20 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (f) and 2 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Lews of the Papago Tribe.
