WESREAS, the G. S. Army Electronic Proving Ground at Fort Munchuca has applied for a lease of one acre of land for one year on top of Waterman Mountain in the northeastern part of the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the applicant proposes to erect a portable tower and portable building for a microwave radio station, and also desires an access road to the site, and

WHEREAS. Schuk Toak District Council has approved the application with the provision that the applicant pay \$75.00 for the land and \$25.00 for the road right of way, and

WHEREAS, the installations will be used in connection with certain tests being conducted by the U. S. Army Electronic Proving Ground.

NOs, THRESPOSS, LET IT BE RESOLVED, by the Papage council that a lease for one year be granted to the U.S. Army Electronic Proving Ground as well as a right of way for an access road, and that the applicant pay the sum of \$75.00 for the one acre of land and \$25.00 for the road right of way.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on March 2, 1962, with a vote of 18 for and 0 against and 2 not voting, Suring a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution ratified on December 13, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
