White das, the rapage Tribal Council in November 1961 passed a resolution directing that the Tribe advance to Mrs. Elizabeth Estrada of Tucson the sum of 31,000.00 for the purchase of baskets to be used in a basket exhibit at the Pima County Fair in March 1962, and that Mrs. Estrada should produce a proper and sufficient bond for the faithful handling of the cash advance and of the proceeds of the sale of baskets, and

WHEREAR, it was later discovered that a bond could not be obtained to cover Mrs. Estrada unless and until she became an employee of the Tribe, and that, upon becoming such employee, Mrs. Estrada would be covered by the same fidelity bond which covers all of the Tribal employees, and

MERICAL, the Council is desirous of increasing the policy limits on the Public Liability and Property Damage insurance on the automobile driven by Mrs. Estrada instability as the will be operating the automobile upon the business of the Tribe and that these limits should be increased to \$100,000-\$200,000, and the Council is desirous of paying the additional premium on this insurance.

NOW, TREEFFORE, LET IT BE RESCEVED, that the Papago Council hereby appoints Mrs. Alizabeth Satrada as Tribal Director of Arts and Crafts at a salary of \$1.00 per year, and that the Tribal Officers are hereby authorized and empowered to enter into a contract of employment with Mrs. Satrada at this salary, that the name of Mrs. Satrada is to be added to the list of Tribal employees now covered by a fidelity bend heretefore jurchased by the Tribe, that the policy limits on the Public Liability and Property Damage insurance on the automobile now driven and to be driven in the future by Mrs. Estrada on Tribal business be increased to \$100,000-\$200,000, and that the Papago Tribe shall pay the additional pressure on this insurance.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on March 2, 1962, with a vote of 20 for and 0 against, during a secting at which a quorus was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (e), Section 2 (l) and Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution ratified on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
