RESCLUTION OF THE FAFAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona is desirous of placing three or four roadside areas for picnicking and relaxation along the Ajo Highway-Route 56, and

WHURDAD, these areas would not be on Reservation property but would be on the right-of way of the State highway, and would be furnished with picnic tables and benches, fireplaces and rest-rooms, and

with Research the Council does not want these areas to be constructed near any residence buildings, and desires that signs be posted at these areas warning the public not to remove any stones or rocks, plants, shrubbery or other saterial belonging to the Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Council requests of the State or Arizona that additional livestock signs be placed along the State highway, and that intersection and cross-roads signs be placed along the highway in the Reservation at all intersections and cross-roads, and

WHERCAS, the Council desires the State of Arisons to enact the necessary ordinances to reduce the speed limits on the highway when passing through villages on the Reservation, especially the villages of Sells and Covered wells.

NOS, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papage Council hereby grants permission to the State of Arizona to place readside areas in whatever number the State chooses, along the Ajo Righway—Route 66, these areas to be furnished with picnic tables and beaches, fireplaces and rest-rooms, these areas not to be constructed near any present residence buildings and to be sufficiently posted warning the public not to remove any stones or rocks, plants, shrubbery, or other material belonging to the Reservation, and the Council further hereby requests the State of Arizona to place additional livestock signs along the State highway, and that intersection and cross-roads signs be placed along the highway in the Reservation at all intersections and cross-roads and that the State enact the necessary ordinances to reduce the speed limits when passing through villages on the Reservation, especially the villages of Sells and Covered Wells.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on March 2, 1962 with a vote of 20 for, and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a), Section 2 (h) and Section 3 (i) of Article V of the Constitution ratified on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant 1978 a Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
