The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on March 2, 1962, with a vote of 15 for, 2 against, and 3 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 of Article IV and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution retified on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago agency and is subject to reschasion by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and Sy-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
