

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

APR 1962

RES. NO. 1226

WHEREAS, the Trico Electric Co-operative of Tucson has applied for a power transmission line right of way which will cross the Garcia Strip $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west of the Garcia Ranch in the Schuk Toak District, and

WHEREAS, the applicant has agreed to pay \$10 for each pole and each anchor placed within the right of way, which right of way is to be 50 feet wide, and

WHEREAS, the Schuk Toak District Council has passed a resolution approving this application for a period of 50 years and providing that the applicant shall have the right to construct and maintain two substantial gates on the Reservation lines at each end of the right of way and that these gates will be kept under lock and key at all times.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribal Council hereby approves the said application of Trico Electric Co-operative of Tucson for a power transmission line right of way which will cross the Garcia Strip $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west of the Garcia Ranch and hereby directs and orders that the applicant pay \$10 for each pole and each anchor placed within the right of way, which right of way is to be 50 feet wide, and

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that this right of way shall be for a period of 50 years and the applicant shall have the right to construct and maintain two substantial gates shall be kept under lock and key at all times.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on April 6, 1962, with a vote of 18 for, 0 against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.

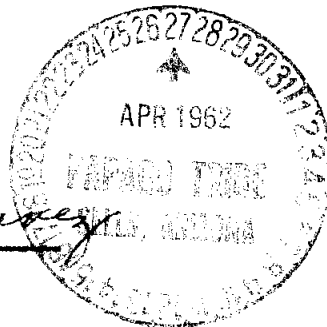
