## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, William H. Coplen, deing business as Quijotoa Trading Post, of Covered Wells, has applied to the Papago Tribal Council for a business lease of 1 acre of land now occupied by him at Covered Wells in the Gu Achi District, said lease to be for a period of 5 years commencing on July 1, 1962, and

WHEREAS, the said William H. Coplen has also applied to the Council for permission to erect 3 signs one mile from the business place, two signs along State Highway 86, on each side of the Trading Post, and one along the Casa Grande road, the rental of said signs to be \$10 per sign per year, and

WHEREAS, the said William H. Coplen has also applied for a right-of-way to lay a 3/4-inch water pipeline from Coplen's home to the Trading Post, a distance of 17 miles (397.5 rods) at the rate of 15 cents per red per year, said right-of-way to be 6 inches underground and to include 5 feet on each side of pipeline, and

WHEREAS, the Resolutions of the Papago Tribal Council provide for an annual rental of such lands of \$75 per acre, to be paid in advance on or before the 1st day of July in each year, and the Gu Achi District Council has approved the granting of the lease, permission for the signs, and permission for the right-of-way.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papage Tribal Council hereby authorizes and approves the granting of a lease of one acre of land as above described for a period of 5 years at an annual rental of \$75, commencing on July 1, 1962, said rental being payable in advance on or before the 1st day of July in each year, for the purposes above set forth, to the said William H. Coplen.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby approves and authorizes the erection of 3 signs at a distance of 1 mile from the Trading Post at the locations above set forth, at a rental fee of \$10 per year per sign.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby authorizes and approves the granting of a right-of-way as above described for the laying of a pipeline for a distance of 397.5 reds at 15 cents per red, tetalling \$59.63 per year.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on May 4, 1962, with a vote of 20 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (c), Section 3 (e) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
