WHEREAS, M. Horton Freilich resigned as Papago Tribal Attorney on January 18, 1962, for the reason that he had recently been appointed Deputy County Attorney for Pima County and there is a rule of that office that Deputy County Attorneys cannot practice law privately, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Council has conferred with Edward B. Berger, an attorney of Tucson, and has duly considered him for appointment as Tribal Attorney, and

WHEREAS, the said Edward B. Berger is a skilled and able attorney, having been admitted to the practice of law in the States of Arisona and New York and now being in a law partnership with Arthur Goldbann, an attorney also of Tucson, and

WHEREAS, the said Edward B. Berger has been recommended for appointment as Tribal Attorney by the said M. Morton Freilich, former Tribal Attorney, and the said Edward B. Berger was formerly Deputy County Attorney of Pina County.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribal Council hereby appoints the said Edward B. Berger as Papago Tribal Atterney under the same terms and conditions set forth in a previous contract, dated June 29, 1961, between the Tribe and the said N. Morton Freilieh, and that the Tribal Officers are hereby authorized and empowered to enter into a contract of employment with the said Edward B. Berger under the said same terms and conditions.

The foregoing Resolution was duly emacted by the Papago Council on May 4, 1962, with a vote of 18 for, 0 against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (b) Section 2 (e), and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
