RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES: NO. 1251

WHEREAS, for some time now Thomas Throssell, Tribal Livestock Clerk-Inspector, has for the most part been working alone in the Tribal Livestock Department, and has had to be on duty every day without exception and often works far into the night. and

WHEREAS, the said Thomas Throssell has not had an annual vacation in several years due to the constant demands of his work and it is felt that an Assistant Livestock Clerk-Inspector should be appointed to assist him, both in the Livestock Office and in going about the Reservation and to the corral, and

WHEREAS, the name of Austin Garcia of Sells has been suggested for appointment to this position as assistant to the said Thomas Throssell, and the Council feels that the said Austin Garcia is suitably qualified for the duties of this position and has a satisfactory educational and training background, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Council is of the opinion that the salary for this new position should be established at \$1.25 per hour for an 8-hour day and a 5-day week without overtime, and

WHEREAS, on May 11th, 1962, the said Austin Garcia was appointed to the said position on a temporary basis, subject to approval and confirmation by the Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby appoints Austin Garcia of the Sells District as Assistant Livestock Clerk-Inspector for the Papago Tribe and hereby confirms, ratifies and approves his temporary appointment to this position on May 11th, 1962, at a salary of \$1.25 per hour for an 8-hour day and a 5-day week without overtime, as a regular appointee of the Tribe, and that the Tribal Officers are hereby authorized and empowered to enter into a contract of employment with the said Austin Garcia at the said salary.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on June 1, 1962, with a vote of 20 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (e), Section 3 (a) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to Rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
