

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1292

WHEREAS, for the past few months the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints has been occupying the Papago Tribal Auditorium on Sundays from 9 A. M. to 1 P. M. without charge, and

WHEREAS, this permission was granted under the provisions of Ordinance No. 17 of the Ordinances of the Papago Council, which Ordinance provides that use of the Tribal facilities shall be without charge, to all groups for events for which no admission is charged, or to which admission is charged for purely charitable or public purposes; and

WHEREAS, this Church, which is also known as the Mormon Church, now offers to pay the Tribe a monthly rental of \$15.00 for the use of the Auditorium on Sundays during the hours mentioned above, and

WHEREAS, it is to the financial benefit of the Tribe to accept the offer of this Church as the payment of such rental shall increase the financial income of the Tribe.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby orders and directs that the Tribal Auditorium be leased to the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints for a period of 1 year commencing on September 1, 1962 at a monthly rental of \$15.00 on each and every Sunday throughout the year between the hours of 9 A. M. and 1 P. M.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribal officers are hereby ordered and authorized to enter into a lease contract with the said Church under each and all of the terms above mentioned.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on August 3, 1962 with a vote of 18 for, 0 against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (c) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
