MARRAS, for the past flow months the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints has been occupying the Papago Tribal Auditorium on Sundays from 9 h. N. to 1 . In without charge, and

TRIMANS, this permission was granted was granted under the provisions of Ordinance No. 17 of the Ordinances of the Papago Council, which Ordinance provides that use of the Tribol facilities shall be without charge, to all groups for events for which no admission is charged, or to which admission is charged for purely charitable or public purposed, and

The Rome, this Shurch, which is also known as the Mormon Church, now offers to pay the Tribe a monthly rental of \$15.00 for the use of the Auditorium on Sundays during the hours mentioned above, and

WHIRMAN, it is to the firmacial benefit of the Tribe to accept the offer of this Church as the payment of such rental shall increase the financial income of the Tribe.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby orders and directs that the Tribal Auditorium be leased to the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints for a period of 1 year commencing on Soptember 1, 1961 at a monthly mental of \$15.00 on each and every Sunday throughout the year between the hours of 9 A. M. and 1 A. M.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribel officers are hereby cruered and sutherized to enter into a lesse centract with the said Churca under such and all of the terms above mentioned.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the rapage douncil on august 3, 1960 with a vote of 18 for, 3 against, and 1 not roting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (c) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papage Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papage Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papage Tribe.
