

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1272

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has made application to the Tribe for a power line right of way 20 feet wide from State Highway 86 to Santa Rosa Ranch School, a distance of approximately 8 miles, and

WHEREAS, the construction of the power line will be of general benefit to the community of Santa Rosa Ranch by making electricity available to those residents who wish to receive such service as well as to the school, and

WHEREAS, the Schuk Toak District Council has passed a resolution approving such application.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby approves and authorizes the establishment of a power line right of way as described above to the Bureau of Indian Affairs without remuneration, and that the Bureau of Indian Affairs shall have the further right to transfer the right of way by assignment, grant, or otherwise.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on September 14, 1962, with a vote of 18 for, 0 against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (c) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936. and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
