RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1278

WHEREAS, the U. S. Air Force--Civil Air Patrol has applied for permission to conduct a Search and Air Rescue Test on the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Test is arranged to resemble an actual airplane crash and will consist of placing a piece of metal 21 feet wide and 20 feet long on the grounds to simulate an actual plane crash, and

WHEREAS, the location of the Test on the Reservation is to be northeast of the Village of Pitoikum in Baboquivari District, and an ambulance will be driven to the location as if there had been a real smash-up, and first aid will be rendered to two dummies which will be placed in the crash to resemble actual people, and

WHEREAS, planes from the Air Force will patrol the area searching for the arranged crash, and the Air Force desires to use this location from Friday afternoon, October 26, 1962 until Sunday afternoon, October 28, 1962 the search to continue during that period until the crash scene is located, and

WHEREAS, such Search and Air Rescue Test will be of great benefit to the Air Force in training its fliers to search for airplane crashes.

NOW, THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribal Council hereby grants permission to the U. S. Air Force--Civil Air Patrol to conduct a Search and Air Rescue Test on the Papago Reservation in the area northeast of the Village of Pitoikum in the Baboquivari District, that permission is given to place a piece of white metal 21 feet wide and 20 feet long on the ground to resemble a crashed airplane, to drive an ambulance to the scene and to render first aid to dummies which will resemble real people.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that permission is hereby granted to use this location from Friday afternoon October 26th, 1962 until Sunday afternoon October 28th, 1962, and that the operation will be performed one time only.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on October 26, 1962, with a vote of 19 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
