RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1282

WHEREAS, the traders and service station operators doing business on the Papago Indian Reservation now pay to the Tribe, in addition to the annual rental, a yearly fee based on the gross receipts, both retail and wholesale, from their businesses, and

WHEREAS, many of these traders and operators collect real estate rent from the premises, both improved and unimproved, which they have leased from the Papago Tribe, and

WHEREAS, it appears in all fairness and equity that the rentals so collected should be included with the gross business receipts in computing the yearly fee due to the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary to modify the present leases in order to include this provision.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby orders and directs that all current and future leases to traders and service station operators doing business upon the Papago Reservation be, and the same hereby are, modified to include the following provision, namely, that all real estate rent collected by the traders and operators from all leased premises upon the Reservation, both improved and unimproved, shall be included with the yearly gross receipts, both retail and wholesale, from the businesses of the traders and operators, in computing the yearly fee due to the Tribe from the said traders and operators.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that in referring to the Papago Reservation this Resolution shall have reference to the Papago, San Kavier and Gila Bend Reservations.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on December 7, 1962, with a vote of 17 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (e) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
