RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1286

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 27 of the Ordinances of the Papago Council, governing the procedure for the election of delegates to the Papago Council and to the various District Councils, was duly enacted in November 1955, and

WHEREAS, there is no provision within the Ordinance concerning procedure to be followed in the event that any part or parts of the Ordinance should be violated by any person or persons in connection with the District Elections, and

WHEREAS, it is felt by the members of the Tribal Council that the Ordinance should be amended to give it greater force and effect, and provision should be made for penalty in the event of violation of the Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby amends Ordinance No. 27 of the Ordinances of the Papago Council by adopting and enacting an additional Section to be known as Section 23, which additional Section shall read as follows:

"Section 23 - Any person or persons convicted of having knowingly and wilfully violated any of the above provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$300, or a jail sentence of six months, or both".

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on January 4, 1963, with a vote of 20 for, 0 against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 Article IV and by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to reconsideration by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
