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RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1292

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council has previously approved a Contract of Employment withe Papago Tribal Attorney, Edward B. Berger, and the Papago Tribe has entered into such Contract of Employment with the said Attorney, and

WHEREAS, the Phoenix Area Office of the Bureau of Indian Affairs has requested that the said Contract be new amended to include the following two set-forth paragraphs, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Council has duly considered this amendment and finds no ebjection therete and the said Tribal Atterney has agreed in writing to the inclusion of the amendment in the Contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby approves and confirms the addition of the following two paragraphs to the Contract between the Papago Tribe and the Tribal Attorney, which Contract has previously been approved by the Papago Council and executed and extered into by the Papago Tribe:

- l. No assignment of the obligations of this contract, in whole or in part, shall be made without the consent, previously obtained of the Tribal Council and the approval of the Secretary of the Interior or his authorized representative nor shall any assignment or encumbrance be made of any interest of the ATTORNEY in the compensation to be paid under this contract, without such consent, Provided, That if such an assignment of the obligations of this contract, or assignment or encumbrance of any interest in the compensation to be paid is made in violation of the provisions of this paragraph, the contract may be terminated at the option of the Secretary of the Interior or the TRIBE, and no attorney having any interest in the contract or in the fee provided herein shall be entitled to any compensation whatever for any services rendered or expenses incurred subsequent to the date of such termination.
- 2. The ATTORNEY shall render to the TRIBE and the Secretary of the Interior or his authorized representative a written report of the services rendered to the TRIBE not less frequently than semiannually and at such other times as may be requested by the Secretary of the Interior or his authorized representative.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the said amendment to the Centract shall have the same force and effect as if it has been originally contained within the Centract and that it shall be so regarded by both the Papage Tribal Attorney and the Papage Indian Tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papage Council on April 5, 1963, with a vote of 20 for, 0 against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (b), Section 2 (c), and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papage Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the

Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
