## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1293

WHEREAS, during the recent illness of Austin Garcia, Assistant Livestock Clerk-Inspector in the Tribal Livestock Department, a large amount of unfinished work accumulated in that Department, necessitating the temporary appointment of an additional person to assist in clearing away this accumulation of work, and

WHEREAS, Sanford S. Throssell of Sells has applied for the temporary position of Clerk in the Livestock Department, has been interviewed by the Administrative Assistant, and has been appointed to the position by the Tribal Chairman, subject to confirmation of the appointment by the Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, it appears that Mr. Throssell is qualified to fill this temporary position, having attended Pueblo High School in Tucson for 2½ years and having been in the Junior Class in high school when he withdrew from school, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Throssell commenced work as Temporary Clerk on March 22, 1963, subject to later confirmation.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby confirms the appointment by the Tribal Chairman of Sanford S. Throssell as Temporary Clerk in the Tribal Livestock Department, said appointment to be effective as of March 22, 1963.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the commencing salary of Mr. Throssell shall be \$1.25 an hour for 8 hours a day and 5 days a week, with no overtime, making an annual salary of \$2,600.00.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on April 5, 1963, with a vote of 19 for, 0 against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (e) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat.984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
