## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1297

WHEREAS, the Baboquivari District Council has previously passed a resolution ordering the removal from the Papago Indian Reservation of a non-Indian, a Mexican man, named Jesus M. Mirando, living in Choulic in said District, on the ground that the said Mirando has violated Tribal, State and Federal laws, and

WHEREAS, the continuance of the residence on the Reservation of the said Mirando will be injurious to the peace, happiness and welfare of the members of the Papage Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the said non-Indian is occupying land on the Papago Reservation without obtaining permission and consent from the Papago Tribal Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESCLVED, that the Papage Council hereby orders and authorizes the immediate removal of the said Jesus M. Mirando from the Papage Reservation.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESCLVED, that the Papago Council hereby orders the immediate constitue and discontinuance of all building and construction of a home in Choulic being built at the present time by the said Jesus M. Mirando.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on May 3, 1963, with a vote of 19 for, 0 against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (h), Section 3 (b) and Section 3 (e) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
