## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1303

WHEREAS, Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company has made application for a telephone line right of way 20 feet wide from a point about two miles northwest of Santa Rosa village on Vaya Chin-Santa Rosa telephone line to Lake Shore Mine, a distance of 17.5 miles, 15.85 Miles in Sid Oidak District and 1.65 miles in Gu Achi District, and

WHEREAS, the said telephone line will make telephone service available to Anegam and Gu Komelik villages if the villagers so desire, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Council believes such telephone service will prove to be beneficial to both Sif Oldak and Gu Achi Districts, and

WHEREAS, both Sif Oidak and Gu Achi District Councils have passed a Resolution in favor of the establishment of such telephone line, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 1127 of the Papago Council provides for payment to the Papago Tribe only in the event that such telephone line is established.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby approves and authorizes the establishment of a telephone line by the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company with a right of way 20 feet wide from a point about two miles northwest of Santa Rosa village on Vaya Chin-Santa Rosa telephone line to Lake Shore Mine, a distance of 17.5 miles, 15.85 miles in Sif Oidak District and 1.65 miles in Gu Achi District, with a price of \$1.00 per pole as compensation for the right of way, and that the income from the establishment of such line shall be paid only to the Papago Tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on May 3, 1963, with a vote of 18 for, 0 against, and 2 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (c), Section 3 (e), and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
