

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1308

WHEREAS, at a meeting held on May 11, 1963, at which a quorum was present, the Chukut Kuk District Council approved a budget for the 1964 fiscal year, and has submitted it to the Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the District had a balance of \$8,332.24 on May 11, 1963, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council has considered the proposed budget and finds it reasonable and to the benefit of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, by the Papago Council that the Chukut Kuk District Budget for the 1964 fiscal year be approved as follows:




TOTAL BUDGET \$2,500.00

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the District Treasurer or his authorized representative be authorized and permitted to sign purchase orders for the above purposes up to the amounts specified, and the Treasurer of the Papago Tribal Council be authorized to sign vouchers for payment of these orders against the District IIM Account, Pt-1R.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on June 7, 1963, with a vote of 19 for, 0 against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (a) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, Stat. 984, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
