

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1914

WHEREAS, William Ackerman, a non-Indian who is married to a Papage woman, has previously applied to the Schuk Toak District Council for permission to build a home in said District and to reside in said home, and the said District Council in regular and official action voted to disapprove and deny said permission, and

WHEREAS, the Papage Tribal Council at its regular meeting on October 26, 1962, unanimously voted to approve the action of the Schuk Toak District in disapproving and denying said permission to the said William Ackerman, and

WHEREAS, despite the above-mentioned action of the Schuk Toak District Council and the Papage Tribal Council, the said William Ackerman continued with the construction of his home in the said Schuk Toak District and the said home is now completely built, and

WHEREAS, on November 9, 1962 the Papage Tribe notified the said William Ackerman by letter of the action of the District Council and the Tribal Council and further advised the said William Ackerman that he was to stop and discontinue immediately the building of the said home, and

WHEREAS, the said William Ackerman persists and continues to live in the said home in the Schuk Toak District and refuses to move from the Reservation in compliance with the actions of the District Council and Tribal Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papage Council hereby orders and directs that written notice be given to the said William Ackerman to remove from the Papage Reservation within ten (10) days after receipt of such notice by him.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that, in the event the said William Ackerman does not remove himself from the Reservation in compliance with such notice, the U.S. Attorney or his Deputy in Tucson, Arizona, be requested to commence a criminal trespass action against the said William Ackerman for his failure to remove himself from the Papage Reservation.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papage Council on July 12, 1963, with a vote of 21 for, 0 against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (e) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papage Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papage Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papage Tribe.
