

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1323

WHEREAS, on June 7, 1963, by virtue of Tribal Resolution No. 1313, the Papago Tribal Council recommended to the Bureau of Indian Affairs that Joe Thomas, a member of the Papago Tribe, residing in the Village of Ventana on the Papago Reservation, be appointed Associate Judge of the Papago Tribal Court, at a salary of \$10.00 per day or a fraction of a day, whenever he so serves as said Associate Judge, and

WHEREAS, Judge Thomas has served the Papago Tribe as Associate Judge for several years under a previous appointment or appointments and has served his earlier appointment without any increase in pay, and

WHEREAS, Tribal Judge Thomas has served the Tribe as Associate Judge of the Court in a satisfactory manner and has performed his important duties in a conscientious manner and has performed his judicial services impartially and without bias, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is desirous of increasing the daily wage rate of Tribal Judge Thomas in the amount of \$5.00 per day plus mileage, and


WHEREAS, this proposed increase in the salary of Judge Thomas may be taken from the 1964 fiscal year Budget of the Tribal Law and Order Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby orders and directs that the daily pay rate of Judge Thomas be increased in the amount of \$5.00 plus mileage, which increase will make the daily pay rate of Judge Thomas \$15.00 per day plus mileage, and that such increase in salary shall be taken from the 1964 fiscal year Budget of the Tribal Law and Order Department.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on July 12, 1963, with a vote of 18 for, 0 against, and 4 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (a), Section 3 (b) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
