RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1325

WHEREAS, at a meeting held July 13, 1963, at which a quorum was present, the Baboquivari District Council approved a Budget for the 1964 fiscal year and has submitted it to the Papago Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council has considered the approved Budget and finds it reasonable and to the benefit of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, by the Papago Tribal Council that the Baboquivari District Budget for the 1964 fiscal year be approved as follows:

At the end of the 1963 fiscal year the Baboquivari District had a balance of \$1,199.92 in its District Treasury.

Gasoline for Wells	\$ 800.00
Engine Repairs for Well Operation	400.00
Salt for Livestock	300.00
Office Equipment and Supplies	25.00
Miscellaneous Expense	200.00
Range Improvement (to be expended only by District Council Resolution)	400.00

2,125.00

While the proposed expenditures are larger than the cash balance now on hand, the District during the current fiscal year will receive grazing fees in the approximate amount of \$1,000.00. In addition, if, during the course of the fiscal year, income does not come up to expected standards, the District will make a comparative reduction in expenditures.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Baboquivari District or his authorized representative be permitted to sign purchase orders for the above purposes in the amounts specified.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on August 2, 1963, with a vote of 21 for, O against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
