RESOLUTION OF TRE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1332

WHEREAS, Eugene J. Johnson, Papago Tribal Chairman, has applied for an increase in his salary from the present figure of \$4,800.00 per year, and

WHEREAS, the workload in the Tribal Office has increased considerably during the past year for the reason that the business of the Tribe is expanding in all directions, and

WHEREAS, during the past summer the Tribal Chairman inaugurated two new summer youth projects on the Reservation, the Babequivari Cabin Project and the Tribal Herd Project, and devoted many hours of his time in preparing the program and in obtaining the young Papagos to attend these projects, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Chairman has represented the Tribe in the sessions of the National Congress of American Indians and of the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Chairman has devoted all of his waking hours since his election as Chairman last Pebruary to the advancement and development of the Tribe, and has spent a great portion of time in endeavoring to assist in the individual problems and matters of the individual Papagos, and

WHEREAS, provision has been made in the Tribal 1964 Fiscal Year Budget for this increase, and the Sells District Council has passed a Resolution approving an increase.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby grants and approves an increase in the salary of the Tribal Chairman to \$5,300.00 per year, commencing on November 1st, 1963, and hereby orders and directs the Papago Tribal Treasurer to prepare and issue the necessary vouchers showing such increased salary figure.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on October 11, 1963, with a vote of 17 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
