RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1339

WHEREAS, God in His infinite wisdom has removed from our midst John Fitzgerald Kennedy, the 35th President of the United States, and

WHEREAS, his death brings to an end a brilliant career dedicated to the well-being of his country and the world, and

WHEREAS, few men have touched with the magic of genius so much of the human elements of life as did Mr. Kennedy, and

WHEREAS, only the few have the vision to see and the courage to dare attain the prominence and the leadership in great endeavors that were his, and

WHEREAS, honor lighted his path; righteousness guided his feet, and his heart was filled with love for his fellowmen, and

WHEREAS, the fallen President in his lifetime was a good and devoted friend of the Papago Tribe and on occasion had singled out the Tribe for recognition and praise.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribal Council and the Papago Tribe of Arizona join the nation in mourning the passing of John F. Kennedy, a man who greatly enriched the life of civilization.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that when this Tribal Council adjourns this day, it adjourn in respect to the memory of the late John Fitzgerald Kennedy.

The above Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on December 6, 1963, with a vote of 19 for, O against, and 3 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
