RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1400

WHEREAS, a meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Congress of American Indians will be held in the City of Washington, D. C., commencing on January 20, 1965, and

WHEREAS, Tribal Chairman Eugene J. Jehnsen is a Regional Vice President of the National Congress in charge of the Phoenix, Arizona Area, and his attendance at the said Executive Committee meeting is urgently needed, and

WHEREAS, William Farrison, a resident of Washington, D.C. and a member of the Papage Indian Tribe, is interested in the functioning of the National Congress, and because of his membership in the Papage Tribe is willing to attend, and is desired of attending, the said meeting of the Executive Committee, and

WHEREAS, it will be to the benefit and advantage of the Papage Tribe to have representatives at this important meeting.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papage Tribal Council hereby names and appeints Tribal Chairman Eugene J. Jehnson and William Farrison of Washington, D.C. as efficial representatives of the Papage Tribe to attend the meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Congress of American Indians, commencing in Washington, D.C. on January 20, 1965.

The feregeing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papage Council on January 8, 1965, with a vote of 19 fer, 0 against, and 1 net voting, during a meeting at which a querum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2(f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papage Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
