## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 1410

WHEREAS, the Baboquivari District Council at a meeting held April 3, 1965 passed a resolution at which a quorum was present, by a vote of 32 for, and O against, to establish a youth camp in the district under Title 1 of Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, Public Law 88-462, and

WHEREAS, the Baboquivari District has designated a site of approximately 40 acres for the camp to be located about 8 miles South of Sells and East of the Sells-Topawa road, and

WHEREAS, the construction of buildings, well, power lines, sewerage system, and fences be established and fully controlled by the Youth Camp Program personnel, and

WHEREAS, the Baboquivari District agreed that whenever the camp site is abandoned by the Youth Camp program under the said Act that the existing buildings, well, fences, and materials revert to, and become the property of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Youth Camp be established under the terms stated above.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on July 2, 1965 with a vote of 19 for, O against, and 3 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) and Section 3 (h) of Article 5 of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16, of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, pursuant to Section 6 of the Article 5 of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
