

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, The Papage Tribal Council is interested in maintaining a good reputation among its creditors, and

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Council's attention that there is outstanding approximately \$20,000.00 in obligations due to various creditors, and

WHEREAS, these funds have been due and owing for a considerable period of time, and

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Papage Tribal Council hereby requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to obtain the sum of \$20,000.00 from the account of the Papage Tribe in the United States Treasury forthwith. Said funds are to be placed in the Tribal Treasury and the Council hereby orders and directs the Tribal Officials to pay the creditors of the Tribe immediately and report the results to said Council at the next Tribal Council meeting.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papage Council on August 6, 1965, with a vote of 21 for, 0 against, and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (b) and Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papage Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papage Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papage Tribe.
