

**RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO TRIBE**

Res. No. 1425

WHEREAS, The Senate and the House of Representative of the United States did on August 11, 1964 enact the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, thereby stated it to be the policy of the United States to eliminate the paradox of poverty in the midst of plenty in this nation by opening to everyone the opportunity for education and training, the opportunity to work, and the opportunity to live in decency and dignity, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council did on September 2, 1964 receive official notification that the Papago Tribe had been selected as one of thirteen tribes in the United States to be permitted, under the provisions of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, to prepare a program of assistance and submit the said program to the Office of Economic Opportunity, Executive Office of the President, for his consideration, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council did on September 5, 1964 appoint Cipriano J. Manuel, Robert C. Mackett, Ramona Jones, Malinda Miguel, Marjorie Paella, Della Ruth Williams, Raymond Narche, Mark Lopez, Phillip Salcido, and Durten Ems to the Community Action Program Committee and instructed the said committee to begin immediately the work of formulating a Community Action Program for the Papago Tribe for submission to the Office of Economic Opportunity, Executive Office of the President, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council did authorize the Community Action Program Committee to make investigations, studies, surveys and to do such other work as may be necessary for the formulation of a Community Action Program for the Papago Tribe, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council did authorize the Community Action Program Committee to make such arrangements as may be necessary to the proper management of its affairs and authorized it to hire a Director, and such other personnel as may be necessary for the development and implementation of a Papago Community Action Program, and

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council inadvertently established the drafting of the Resolution of the Papago Council setting forth the above action,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Papago Council that the above mentioned action is hereby approved and made retroactive to September 5, 1964.

The foregoing resolution was on October 1, 1965 duly enacted by a vote of 19 for and 1 against, by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2(a), (e), and (f) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
