RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBE

Res. No. 1425

WHEREAS, The Senate and the House of Representative of the United States did on August 11, 1964 enact the Escapenic Opportunity Act of 1964, thereby stated it to be the policy of the United States to climinate the paradox of poverty in the midst of plenty in this nation by opening to everyone the opportunity for education and training, the opportunity to work, and the opportunity to live in decemey and dignity, and

WHEREAS, The Papage Council did on September 2, 1964 receive official notification that the Papago Tribe had been selected as one of thirteen tribes in the United States to be permitted, under the previsions of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, to prepare a program of assistance and submit the said program to the Office of Economic Opportunity, Executive Office of the President, for his consideration, and

WHEREAS, The Papage Council did on September 5, 1964 appoint Cipriano J. Manuel, Robert C. Mackett, Ramona Jones, Malinda Miguel, Marjorie Puella, Della Ruth Williams, Raymond Narche, Mark Lopes, Phillip Salcido, and Burton Enes to the Community Action Program Committee and instructed the said committee to begin immediately the work of formulating a Community Action Program for the Papage Whibe for submission to the Office of Economic Opportunity, Executive Office of the President, and

WHEREAS, The Papage Council did authorize the Community Action Program Committee to make investigations, studies, surveys and to do such other work as may be necessary for the fermulation of a Community Action Program for the Papage Tribe, and

WHEREAS, The Papage Council did authorize the Community Action Program Committee to make such arrangements as may be necessary to the proper management of its affairs and authorized it to hire a Director, and such other personnel as may be necessary for the development and implementation of a Papage Community Action Program, and

WHEREAS, The Tries Council setting forth the above action,

THEREFORE, HE IT HESOLVED, by the Papage Council that the above mentioned action is hereby approved and made retreactive to September 5, 1965.

The foregoing resolution was on October 1, 1965 duly enacted by a vote of 19 for and 1 against, by the Papage Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2(a), (e), and (f) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papage Agency, and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
