

RESOLUTIONS OF THE PARADO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1931

WHEREAS, the Indian Claims Commission was created by the act of Congress of August 21, 1946, (54 Stat. 1649, 28 U.S.C. 1616) to determine Indian Claims which were first submitted between July 1, 1945, and August 13, 1946, and

and whereas, under the terms of said act the jurisdiction of the Commission was to terminate not later than two years after the first meeting which date of termination would have been April 13, 1957, and

and whereas, the life of the Indian Claims Commission has been extended on two different occasions and the second extension of the said Commission also has failed to extend the life of the Commission, however, due to differences, no action was taken,

and whereas, the life of the said Indian Claims Commission will expire on April 13, 1957, unless an additional extension is granted by the 85th Congress, and

and whereas, a report of the Indian Claims Commission was filed with the Department of Justice in which were stated that the Commission has been unable to complete its work and that it is necessary to extend the life of the Commission and the Department of Justice, and

and whereas, by agreement made by the Indian Claims Commission and the Department of Justice it will be impossible to finally dispose of all the pending cases over by April, 1957, and

and whereas, it was the intention of the Congress that Indian Claims should have their day in court by the establishment of the Indian Claims Commission so that they may once and for all have their claims against the Government adjudicated.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PARADO COUNCIL, that it is the sense and respectfully requests and urges the 85th Congress to provide such extension of the life of the Indian Claims Commission so that the said Commission may be able to dispose of all the cases pending before the Commission.

The foregoing Resolution was duly adopted by the Parado Council on December 10, 1956, with a vote of 19 for and 2 against having a

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1501

WHEREAS, the Indian Claims Commission was created by the Act of Congress of August 13, 1946, 60 Stat. 1049, (25 USC 70) to adjudicate Indian Claims which came into existence between July 4, 1776, and August 13, 1946, and

WHEREAS, under the terms of said act the existence of the Commission was to terminate not later than ten years after its first meeting which date of termination would have been April 10, 1957, and

WHEREAS, the life of the Indian Claims Commission has been extended on two different occasions and the Second Session of the 89th Congress also had before it bills to extend the life of the Commission, however, due to differences, no action was taken, and

WHEREAS, the life of the said Indian Claims Commission will expire on April 10, 1967, unless an additional extension is granted by the 90th Congress, and

WHEREAS, a total of 370 Claims were filed which were broken down by the Claims Commission into 580 dockets and there still remain 352 claims or dockets in which some action must still be taken (according to the records of the Claims Commission and the Department of Justice), and

WHEREAS, by statements made by the Indian Claims Commission and the Department of Justice it will be impossible to finally dispose of all the pending cases even by April, 1969, and

WHEREAS, it was the intention of the Congress that Indian Tribes should have their day in court by the establishment of the Indian Claims Commission so that they may once and for all have their claims against the government adjudicated.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council, that it endorses and respectfully requests and urges the 90th Congress to provide such extension of the life of the Indian Claims Commission to the end that a just completion may be had of all the tribal claims pending before the Commission.

Resolved, that a motion be passed, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (1) and Section 2 (2) of Article V of the Constitution and by-laws of the Parago Tribe, as amended by the Interior on December 11, 1935, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 15, 1934, said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval of the Superintendent of the Parago Agency and its acceptance of resolution by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and by-laws of the Parago Tribe.
