RESOLUTION OF THE PARAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1907

WHEREAS, the Parago Tribal Council is interested in the education and welfare of its Parago youth, and

WHEREAS, many Parago students attend boarding schools off the reservation, and

WHEREAS, it has been called to the attention of the Tribal Council that the boarding schools are grossly understaffed, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of all concerned to have competent and well-staffed boarding schools off the reservation, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable for the Tribal Officials as well as the Bureau of Indian Affairs Officials to make regular visits to said boarding schools, and

WHEREAS, this resolution is not intended to be critical of the Bureau of Indian Affairs' program nor of any individuals, but for the purpose to encourage the Bureau to do a superior job.

NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED BY THE PARAGO COUNCIL THAT:

1. The Bureau of Indian Affairs appropriate sufficient funds so that the boarding schools on the Parago Reservation are adequately staffed with competent employees;
2. Sufficient funds be appropriated to provide for regular visits by Tribal Officials and Bureau of Indian Affairs Officials to said schools; and
3. Members of the Parago Delegation in Congress be properly informed of this request of the Parago Council, and their assistance requested to obtain the necessary funds to carry out the above stated wishes of the Parago Council and the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was duly passed by the Parago Council on February 10, 1967, with a vote of 19 for and 0 against and 0 not voting at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to the provisions of the Parago Constitution and By-Laws of the Parago Tribe as amended on December 12, 1966, and approved by the Secretary of

2. Sufficient funds be appropriated to provide for regular visitation by Tribal Officials and Bureau of Indian Affairs Officials to said schools; and
3. Members of the Arizona Delegation in Congress be properly informed of this request of the Papago Council, and their assistance requested to obtain the necessary funds to carry out the above stated wishes of the Papago Council and the Papago Council.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on February 10, 1967, with a vote of 19 for and 0 against and 0 not voting, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (f) and (k) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of
