RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1507

WHEREAS, Mark Joaquin reported to the Tribal Council concerning the Tribal Herd Ranch, and

WHEREAS, it was called to the attention of Mark Joaquin that the Tribal Herd Ranch was paying more to register its cattle and that it would be less expensive to said Tribal Herd Ranch if it became a lifetime member of the Polled Hereford Association, and

WHEREAS, the cost for becoming a life member in the Association is the total sum of \$50.00,

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council hereby authorizes the Tribal Herd Ranch to become a life member of the Polled Hereford Association.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council on February 10, 1967, with a vote of 18 for and 0 against, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2(f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
