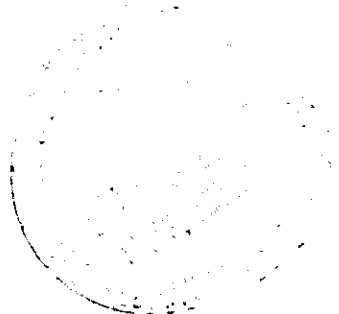

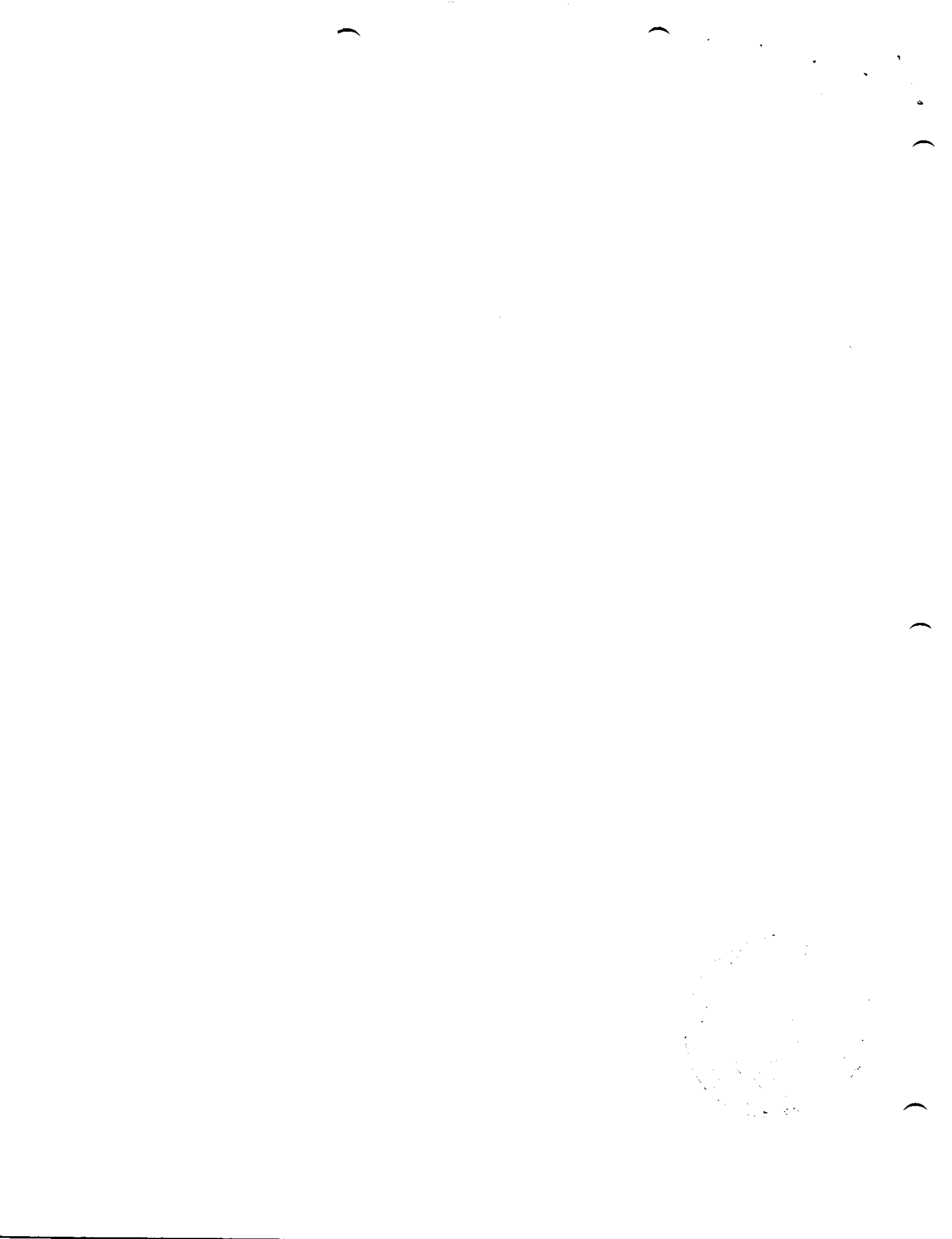

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1515

WHEREAS, the Corps of Engineers, Washington, D. C., has proposed to the Sif Oidak District Council to lease approximately 14.72 acres of unused Tribal land for an aerial camera test range in the vicinity of the Papago village of Chuichu, and

WHEREAS, the Sif Oidak District Council and Corps of Engineers has agreed that the test range will be located in T. 7 S., R. 5 E.; and T. 8 & 9 S., R. 5 & 6 E., Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the Corps of Engineers has offered to pay an annual rental of \$1,600.00 per annum for the term of the lease which begins March 1, 1967, and ends June 30, 1971, and

WHEREAS, an appraisal by the Bureau of Indian Affairs shows the offer to be to the advantage of the Sif Oidak District and the Papago Tribe.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council hereby approves the granting of a four year and four month lease to the Corps of Engineers at an annual rental of \$1,600.00, for 14.72 acres of land which shall be utilized for an aerial camera test range, and

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Papago Tribal Council are hereby empowered to execute said lease on behalf of the Papago Tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council on May 22, 1967, with a vote of 16 for, 0 against, with 0 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of Interior pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
