

RESOLUTION OF THE PARAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 123

WHEREAS, at a meeting held June 12, 1967 at which a program was present, the Hopovivort District Council approved a budget for the 1968 Fiscal Year, and

WHEREAS, the Parago Tribal Council has considered the approved budget and finds it reasonable and to the benefit of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Parago Tribal Council that the Hopovivort District Budget for the 1968 Fiscal Year be approved as follows:

1. Gasoline for water pump engines	\$200.00
2. Engine Repairs	400.00
3. Payment of Electric Bill for Topaw Village (\$10 per month)	120.00
4. District Fence Maintenance including supplies and hired help	440.00
5. Miscellaneous Fund	282.64
Total	\$1,742.64

At the end of the Fiscal Year 1967, the Hopovivort District had a balance of \$731.64 in its District Treasury. While the proposed expenditure is larger than the balance now on hand, the district during the current fiscal year, will receive grazing fees in the amount of \$1,011.00. In addition, if during the course of the fiscal year, the income does not come up to the expected level, the district will make a comparative reduction in expenditures.



LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the District Chairman or the Vice-Chairman of the Hopovivort District Council be permitted to sign purchase orders for the above purposes in the amounts specified.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Parago Council on June 18, 1967 with a vote of 12 for, 0 against and 3 not voting, during a meeting at which a program was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3(7) of Article V of the Constitution and by-laws of the Parago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1933 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 14 of the Act of June 18, 1934.

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council has considered the approved budge and finds it reasonable and to the benefit of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, by the Papago Tribal Council that the Baboquivori District Budget for the 1968 Fiscal Year be approved as follows:

1. Gasoline for water Pump Engines	\$500.00
2. Engine Repairs	400.00
3. Payment of Electric Bill for Topawa Village (\$10 per month)	120.00
4. District Fence Maintenance including supplies and hired help	440.00
5. Miscellaneous Fund	<u>282.64</u>
Total	\$1,742.64

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on June 16, 1967 with a vote of 18 for 0 against and 3 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2(f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
