

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1537

WHEREAS, the Indian Development District of Arizona is a proposed statewide federation of Tribes to help the individual Tribes promote jobs and developments on Indian lands, and

WHEREAS, the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 requires districting for the purpose of more effectively planning and carrying out projects for the respective areas, and

WHEREAS, the Indian Development District of Arizona will be a unified, coordinated organization created to assist the Indian Tribes in obtaining greater financial assistance with a minimum of delay from the Economic Development Administration, Small Business Administration, Housing and Urban Development, and other governmental and private sources and

WHEREAS, the Indian Development District of Arizona will be a non-profit Arizona corporation, owned and controlled by Indian Tribes, and

WHEREAS, the first annual membership investment for the Tribe will be \$500.00,

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it authorizes the participation of the Tribe in the Indian Development District of Arizona and authorizes the Chairman or his representative to act as an incorporator of said District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council appropriates the sum of \$500.00 as the first annual membership investment toward the 25% in cash or in kind required by the Economic Development Administration.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council on July 18, 1967, with a vote of 15 for, 0 against, with 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Sections 2 (f) and 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said

resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of Interior pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
