

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1553

WHEREAS, Chapter 1, Section 2 of the Papago Tribal Law and Order Code provides for the appointment of two associate judges, for the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, there is presently only one associate judge and it is necessary that a second associate be appointed to serve at times when the first associate Judge is unable to serve, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council has selected Malinda Miguel, a member of the Papago Tribe and a resident of Sells, for appointment as an Associate Judge.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it recommends to the Bureau of Indian Affairs that Malinda Miguel be appointed as the second associate Judge of the Papago Tribal Court, to serve when her services are required at \$10.00 per day, or fraction thereof, and that 10¢ per mile be paid for mileage from her village and back in addition to her salary as Tribal Secretary.

PROVIDED that such pay and travel expenses shall be paid from Tribal funds budgeted for the associate judges, and

PROVIDED FURTHER that in accordance with the provisions of the Papago Law and Order Code, such appointment shall be effective for a period of two years.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council on September 14, 1967, with a vote of 12 for, 3 against, with 0 not voting, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Sections 2 (f) and 3 (b) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
