RES. NO. 32-71

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, Joseph M. Lucero, advised The Papago Council of a "Free Grain Program" available in Casa Grande, and

WHEREAS, a carload of food supplement pellets for livestock would be available to The Tribe at a price of \$7,000.00 for 190 tons of said pellets, and

WHEREAS, the 190 tons of pellets could be stored at one of the radar stations on the Reservations, and

WHEREAS; the livestock would benefit greatly from this supplemental feed, consisting of molasses, vitamin A and other nutrients, and

WHEREAS, The Tribe will be able to sell the pellets to individual stock owners at approximately \$1.85 per sack,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL that the program proposed by Superintendent Lucero be implemented and that the Treasurer be directed to appropriate funds in the amount of \$7,000.00 as payment for 190 tons of pellets for livestock, with the pellets being stored at one of the radar stations on the Reservation and being sold to individuals for livestock feeding at \$1.85 per sack.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the 2nd day of July, 1971, with a vote of 19 for, 0 against, 0 not voting, and 3 absent, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 3(a) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by The Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of The Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
