RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 48-71

WHEREAS, surplus commodities are available to the Papago people; and

WHEREAS, it has been suggested that a warehouse is needed in which to store these surplus commodities which are to be distributed to the Papagos; and

WHEREAS, to build a warehouse to house these surplus commodities`at Sells would cost approximately \$70,000 to \$80,000; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Papago Tribe to investigate the building of such a warehouse,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL that an immediate investigation be made into the feasibility and cost estimate of building a warehouse at Sells for the storing of surplus commodities.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the 27th day of May, 1971, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 19 for, 1 against, -0- not voting, and 2 absent, pursuant to authority vested in The Papago Council by Article V, Sections 2(d) and (h) and 3(a) and (k), of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by The apago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
