

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 65-71

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe is interested in its employees and the organized, businesslike growth of its Tribal operations; and

WHEREAS, on the 2nd day of July, 1971, The Papago Council, by Resolution No. 30-71, formed the Personnel/Fiscal Committee to review certain policies and procedures of The Papago Tribe; and

WHEREAS, in the past it has been understood that Tribal employees are subject to the policies and administrative procedures of The Papago Tribe; and

WHEREAS, at present there are many funded programs in operation on the Reservation, such as:

- O.E.O.
- Nutrition
- CHR
- TWEP
- Alcohol - Mental Health
- Otitus Media
- Title I

and many "Buy Indian Contracts", such as:

- Santa Rosa Maintenance and Operation
- Law and Order
- Book mobile
- Job survey
- Music room
- Teacher aids
- Education Director

and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Personnel Committee that the funded programs, including but not limited to the above mentioned programs, be subject to the policies and administrative procedures of The Papago Tribe; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of The Papago Tribe to ensure that there be uniformity and equity in the administration of all Tribal Operations,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL that effective immediately all personnel employed under "Buy Indian Contracts", Funded Programs, Grants, Contracts and Agreements are considered to

be governed by the Personnel Policies and Administrative Procedures of The Papago Tribe of Arizona; and the Business Manager of The Papago Tribe is hereby instructed and directed to ensure compliance with this Resolution.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the 17 day of September, 1971, with a vote of 20 for, 0 against 2 not voting, and 0 absent, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in The Papago Council by Article V, Section 2(a), (d) and (f) of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
