

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 84-71

WHEREAS, The Papago Council has been approached by a group, namely, Flora Segundo, Lucille Throssell and Madeline Toro, concerning the formation of an Arts and Crafts Guild on the Reservation; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interests of The Papago Tribe for the Council to encourage a plan for formation of an Arts and Crafts Guild;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL that Flora Segundo, Lucille Throssell and Madeline Toro be authorized and encouraged to proceed with their plans for the formation of an Arts and Crafts Guild on the Reservation.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the 26th day of November, 1971, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 20 for, -0- against, -0- not voting, and 2 absent, pursuant to authority vested in The Papago Council by Section 2(1) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
