

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 10-72

WHEREAS, a resolution was presented The Papago Council by the Parent-Teachers Safety Committee requesting that the Council take action on having 25 MPH speed limits placed at each end of the road directly in front of the Indian Oasis Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of The Council this resolution was an excellent suggestion; and

WHEREAS, it was suggested that 15 MPH speed limits would be even more satisfactory, that painting of crosswalks would be advisable and that the use of a school patrol might be a possibility;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

1. That speed limit signs of 15 MPH would be placed at each end of the road directly in front of the Indian Oasis Elementary School; and
2. That crosswalks are to be painted in the appropriate area in front of the Indian Oasis Elementary School; and
3. That investigation of the possibility of a school patrol is to be undertaken.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the 3rd day of March, 1972, during a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 18 for, -0- against, 2 not voting, and 2 absent, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 2(h) and (k) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of The Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency.
