

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 11-72

WHEREAS, a resolution from the Sif Oidak District was presented to The Papago Council setting forth a complaint against Dan Martinez, Papago Tribal Policeman; said complaint stating that Mr. Martinez, when making an arrest on liquor violation, has in the past had the vehicle impounded in Casa Grande, thus causing the arrested individual financial difficulties in paying towing charges; and

WHEREAS, it has been deemed advisable by The Council to follow the suggested resolution to this problem as presented by the Sif Oidak Council, namely, to have the automobile of anyone arrested for transporting liquor parked on the Reservation. A fence will be constructed in Chui Chu so that vehicles impounded will be protected;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL THAT the Sif Oidak Resolution stating that anyone arrested for transporting liquor will have his automobile parked on the Reservation and that a fence will be constructed in Chui Chu so that vehicles impounded will be protected is hereby approved and accepted.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the 3rd day of March, 1972, during a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 20 for, -0- against, 2 not voting, and -0- absent, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 2(f) and (h) of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of The Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency.
