RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 42-72

WHEREAS, the University of Arizona has approached the Papago Tribe with the proposal that the Tribe join with the University of Arizona in an experiment with the Jojoba plant seed; and

WHEREAS, the Jojoba plant is found in abundance on the Papago Reservation; and

WHEREAS, upwards of 100,000 pounds of the seed would be required for experimentation now being conducted by the National Academy of Science in an effort to find and establish uses for the seed; and

WHEREAS, there is a need that these seeds be collected from the Reservation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL that the Tribe will cooperate in this experimental program and will use its best efforts to collect the Jojoba seed for the University of Arizona's experimental program.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the 7th day of July, 1972, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 16 for, 3 not voting, -0- against, and 3 absent, pursuant to authority vested in The Papago Council by Section 2(f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
