RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

NO. <u>40-71</u> WHEREAS, Edward Kisto is a tribal member engaged in the maintenance of the Sells Agency grounds and in the business of landscaping as a private contractor, and WHEREAS, Edward Kisto hired a non-Indian, P.C. Lang, to assist him with said business ventures, and WHEREAS, Edward Kisto now has reason to believe and complains that P.C. Lang presents a threat to the peace and welfare of members of the Tribe, that P.C. Lang has threatened bodily harm to Edward Kisto, and that P.C. Lang has violated the following provisions of the Law and Order Code of the Papago Tribe: Chapter 5, Sections 1, 6, 7, and 16 and Chapter 6, Sections 1 and 2. NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, due notice be given P.C. Lang to appear before the Papago Tribal Court for a hearing and if the court determines upon hearing that P.C. Lang has violated any provision of Chapter 5 or 6 of the Law and Order Code, the Superintendent and the Papago police should proceed to remove P.C. Lang from the reservation. The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the day of ________, 1972, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of ________ for, ________ Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 State 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
