

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 57-72

WHEREAS, Jacob Escalante has approached The Papago Council with his proposal to complete a concrete plant for the purpose of making concrete blocks; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Escalante has assured the Council that his concrete blocks will be sold at lower prices than those elsewhere available; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Escalante assures the Council that jobs at the concrete plant will be made available to the men of the Papago Tribe; and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council deems it in the best interests of the Papago Tribe to allow Jacob Escalante to proceed with his plans for the concrete plant;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL that Jacob Escalante be, and he is hereby, authorized to proceed with his plans for the proposed concrete plant to be located on the Papago Reservation.


The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the 29 day of September, 1972, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 21 for, 0 against, 0 not voting, and 1 absent, pursuant to authority vested in The Papago Council by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
