RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 71-72

WHEREAS, there has been presented to The Papago Council a resolution of the Sif Oidak District Council concerning the District's wish to remove all non-Indians from the District; and

WHEREAS, the District has suggested that if these undesirable non-Indians refuse to move from the District, then the Papago Police may be requested to remove them from the District; and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council has delivered the opinion that removal of such undesirable elements is within its jurisdiction;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL that resolution of the Sif Oidak District Council concerning the District's wish to remove all undesirable non-Indians from the District is hereby approved;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if such undesirable non-Indians refuse to move from the District, the services of the Papago police may be utilized to remove said undesirable individuals from the District.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the 3rd day of November, 1972, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 18 for, 0 against, 0 not voting, and 4 absent, pursuant to authority vested in The Papago Council by Sections 2 (h) and 3 (c) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
